PROJECT COMPLETION REPORT: MEDICAL & NUTRITION OUTREACH

1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Ikyumenga Community Empowerment Foundation (ICEF) successfully executed a targeted medical and nutritional intervention at the Anyiin IDP Camp and surrounding host community in Logo LGA. This report details the medical services provided to 473 individuals and the nutritional screening of 342 children, highlighting a critical need for ongoing food security and healthcare support in the region.

2. PROJECT OBJECTIVES

- To provide immediate medical relief to IDPs and the host community.
- To identify and treat prevalent ailments resulting from displacement and poor sanitation.
- To screen children for malnutrition using anthropometric standards and provide life- saving supplements.

3. MEDICAL INTERVENTION DATA

The outreach recorded a high turnout, particularly among women, who often bear the primary responsibility for family health in the camp.

3.1 Beneficiary Demographics

Key Observation: The significant percentage of female beneficiaries (approx. **87%**) underscores the need for prioritized maternal and reproductive health services in future interventions at Anyiin.

4. NUTRITION ASSESSMENT & FINDINGS

A specialized team conducted nutritional screenings for **342 children** using Mid-Upper Arm Circumference (MUAC) and weight-for-height measurements.

4.1 Malnutrition Prevalence

Out of the 342 children screened, **47 cases of malnutrition** were identified and categorized as follows:

Classification	Number of Cases	Intervention Provided
Mild Malnutrition (MAM)	40	Provision of fortified nutritional supplements (RUSF) and caregiver education.
Severe Malnutrition (SAM)	7	Immediate administration of RUTF and referral for clinical stabilization.
Healthy Status	295	Routine Vitamin A and deworming.

4.2 Nutrition Intervention Methodology

For the **17 mild cases**, ICEF provided improved nutritional supplements designed to boost caloric intake and micronutrient absorption. For the **7 severe cases**, an intensive therapeutic regimen was initiated to prevent mortality associated with acute wasting.

5. IMPACT AND RECOMMENDATIONS

The outreach successfully bridged the healthcare gap for 473 vulnerable persons. However, the discovery of **7 severely malnourished children** indicates an urgent food security crisis within the Anyiin IDP camp.

Key Recommendations:

- **Continuous Monitoring:** Establish a bi-weekly nutrition surveillance in the camp to follow up and ensure the children are safe.
 - **Supplementary Feeding Programs:** Launch a community-based food demonstration program to support the 40 children with mild malnutrition to prevent them from sliding into the "Severe" category and ensuring the condition did not escalate into community acute malnutrition.
 - **Nutrition Education and counselling:** Trained camp volunteers on nutrition education and counselling support who will be able to facilitate nutrition counselling sessions to caregivers in the camp to ensure sustainable nutrition intervention through the caregivers.
 - **Medical Surgery:** Facilitate and or recommend IDPs with critical illness that require surgical operations to save their lives.
 - **Toilet and convenience repair:** conduct needs assessment on the IDPs to validate their preference regarding the Water Sanitation and Hygiene facility in the camp and to determine the right convenience suitable for the environment to avoid spread of some common infections through the use of dilapidated toilet facility.
 - **Livelihood Support:** Provide the 412 women reached with seeds or small-scale trade tools to improve household food access.
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
